MEDICAL LEARNING CENTRE LAUNCHED AFTER WILSON MASON REFIT



North West based architects Wilson Mason have transformed existing lecture space and office accommodation at Lancaster University into a Clinical Anatomy Learning Centre.

The learning centre, which was launched on Friday 23rd February by the government's principal medical adviser, Sir Liam Donaldson, forms a key part of the University's new Centre for Medical Education. The facility will enable students to study the human body using detailed anatomical models and high-quality DVD presentations.



As consultant architect, Wilson Mason planned the new scheme at the University, which involved the relocation of existing teaching facilities, the enhancement of an access route from ground floor level and the creation of departmental administration accommodation.

Construction costs for the project were £1.3 million.

Naomi Taylor, project coordinator at Wilson Mason, says: "The University had very specific requirements for the facility to provide flexible teaching spaces that could be used in a variety of different arrangements. At the same time, it was a considered important to provide a light and airy environment that reflects the character of the subject matter and which is visually stimulating."

Professor Anne Garden, Director of the Centre for Medical Education at Lancaster University, says: "The new Clinical Anatomy Learning Centre will make a tremendous difference to students, providing them with easy access to top quality learning resources."
